HELLO FROM THE PRINCIPAL!

Dear Parents/Caregivers & Friends of the School:

I am certain that everyone is refreshed and ready for the start of another school term and it's certainly pleasing to see students enthusiastically getting back into school routines.

Ruru 1 and Pukeko 2 have swapped classroom spaces and we await the completion of our new classroom to eventually accommodate Kiwi 4 that will be used as a junior teaching space – just a few small shifts to complement our school organization.

Mrs Mary Steele begins Term 3 looking after our Reading Recovery programme and we therefore welcome Mrs Ann Rush as the new teacher for Kiwi 2 students. Mrs Vivienne Lee, who teaches Spanish and Music every Friday, is currently in Spain on a three-week scholarship to the University of Granada. She is keeping in contact with our Years 7 and 8 pupils through Skype and blogs. As many of our children are cross-grouped for mathematics you may be visiting a class that is different to your child's normal homeroom so check with your child to make sure you know which room to go to! If you have children in different year levels and need to move between classes, please be mindful that you may have missed the instructions being given at the start of the lesson. We look forward to sharing our mathematics programmes with you and encourage you to come and see what fantastic work your children are doing in mathematics!

Born with a bang, I just made it to the 2nd of April ... so missed out being an April Fool's baby (although proximity to this date has possibly contributed to the wild & wacky dress-ups I sometimes parade in).

I grew up in Hillpark and went to Hillpark Primary School until I was ten. I was devastated by the news that we were shifting as I so desperately wanted to be a Road Patrol Monitor (boo!hoo!).
